

CODE OF CONDUCT AT HHG (rev 1.14.26)

Honor God in All We Do

We strive to glorify God in our words, actions, attitudes, and choices, remembering that we represent Christ in our school community.

Whatever you do... do it all for the glory of God.-- 1 Corinthians 10:31

Speak with Respect and Love

We use language that builds others up. Students must use respectful and appropriate language at all times. Hateful, degrading, harassing, discriminatory, or threatening speech—verbal, written, digital, or symbolic—is prohibited.

Let no unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up.-- Ephesians 4:29

Maintain Peace and Safety

Fighting, physical aggression, threats, intimidation, or any acts of violence are strictly prohibited. We commit to resolving conflict peacefully and seeking help when needed.

Blessed are the peacemakers. --Matthew 5:9

Act with Integrity and Responsibility

We choose honesty and accountability in academics and behavior, taking responsibility for our actions and their consequences.

Whoever walks in integrity walks securely. --Proverbs 10:9

Practice Self-Control, Grace, and Forgiveness

We demonstrate self-discipline, patience, and forgiveness, seeking restoration and reconciliation in our relationships.

Clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.--Colossians 3:12

Students are expected to agree to this code of conduct as a participant at the tutorial.

As an HHG Student, I will:

- Attempt to honor my parents in all that I do (Ex: 20:12)
- Respect, pay attention to, and be thankful for my teachers (Heb 13:1)
- Do all of the work I have been assigned with the best of my ability (Eph 5:8-17)
- Do my best to learn what I can and achieve all that I can (Phil4:8-9)
- Honor and respect the time, work, and feelings of my fellow students (Rom 12:9-18)
- Model honesty, integrity, kindness, and modesty in my relationships (Phil 2:3-7)

Discipline

Typically our students are so engaged in the learning process that we don't have issues. However, should a problem arise, this is the procedure we will follow.

- Teacher will gently remind a student in class if there is a disruption. Usually this is all it takes. In the younger classrooms, the teachers are giving automatic feedback on behavior on Homeschool Life. A good participation grade means it was a good day.
- If an issue isn't resolved by a gentle reminder, the student will be asked to step into the hall to sit with the Check-in Receptionist or a Board Member. At this point, the teacher will send a Homeschool Life message to request a meeting with the parents. A Board Member will also sit in on the meeting.
- Once a meeting with the Teacher, Board and parent happens, the last resort will be expulsion with no refund of any fees paid.

Suspension: Heritage Homeschool Group may suspend a student from classes at the discretion of the Board of Directors in an emergency.

Withdrawal: Parents may be required to remove their student from classes and interview for readmission with administration if deemed necessary by Heritage Homeschool Group Board.

Expulsion: Expulsion from HHG will be at the discretion of the Board. The Board realizes that expelling a student is a very serious matter and should always be carefully dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Expulsion will only happen after consultation with parents, student(s) and Board. Readmission will typically not be considered.

Please note, there will be no refund of funds in the event of suspension, withdrawal, or expulsion.

Immediate Action for Serious Misconduct: Should a student commit an act with such serious consequences that an administrator deems it necessary, suspension or expulsion may be imposed immediately. Examples of such serious misconduct could include:

Acts endangering the lives of other students or staff members.

Gross violence/vandalism to the facilities.

Violations of or the intent of violation of a civil law.

Any act in clear contradiction of scriptural commands.

The Board is authorized to enforce all disciplinary actions, including but not limited to suspensions, the readmission process and expulsions. Appeal of any decision should be made to the HHG Board. All decisions of the Board are final.
