

Heritage Homeschool Group Statement of Faith

Our Statement of Faith includes only those truths upon which all orthodox Christians agree. It concerns the authority of Scripture, Deity of Christ, the Person and Work of Jesus Christ (the Gospel) as revealed in Scripture. It is the faith once delivered to the saints (Jude 1:2, Ephesians 4:5) which distinguishes believers from non-believers. There are many other precious truths taught in the Bible over which godly men have differed in understanding. Therefore, this is not a statement of all that is important to believe, but of all that is essential to believe for Christian fellowship and unity. (Romans 15:7).

Because our tutorial requires parental involvement {where all parents will have involvement with and influence over our children), we feel it imperative that all families involved with our tutorial agree with and are able to sign this Statement of Faith.

We believe:

- 1. The Bible to be the inspired, infallible, divinely preserved Word of God, the supreme and final authority for all faith and life.
- 2. That there is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All three are co-equal, co-eternal, and fully God.
- 3. In the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, His virgin birth, His sinless life, His miracles, His vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood on the cross, His bodily resurrection, His ascension, and His imminent bodily return in power and glory.
- 4. That man was created in the image of God, but fell into sin and is therefore lost, and only those who put their faith in Jesus Christ alone, not trusting in any personal works whatsoever, can be saved.
- 5. That salvation is the free gift of God brought to the sinner by grace and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, Whose substitutionary death on the cross paid the penalty for man's sin.
- 6. That the ministry of the Holy Spirit is to convict mankind, indwell, guide, instruct, and empower the believer for godly living and service.
- 7. That God made all things ex nihilo, or "out of nothing." We believe that God did not use evolutionary processes, but that He made all things as outlined in Genesis 1 and 2. I understand that HHG will teach that He completed His creative work in 6 literal 24 hour consecutive periods of time, and then rested on the 7th day when the subject arises.
- 8. We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as male or female. These two distinct, complimentary genders and sexes together reflect the image of God (Gen 1:26-27).
- 9. We believe that the term "marriage" has only one meaning: the uniting of one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union, as delineated in Scripture (Gen 2:18-25).

STUDENT CONDUCT, BEHAVIOR, AND HOMEWORK POLICY

Attendance at Heritage Homeschool Group Tutorial is a great privilege and comes with certain responsibilities. Please read the following:

I personally accept and agree to the following: I will:

- Attempt to honor my parents in all that I do (Ex: 20:12)
- Respect, pay attention to, be thankful for, and obey my teachers (Heb 13:1)
- Do all of the work I have been assigned to the best of my ability, honestly and with integrity. (Eph 5:8-17) -- Do my best to learn what I can and achieve all that I can (Phil 4:8-9)
- Honor and respect the time, work, and feelings of my fellow students (Rom 12:9-18) Model honesty, integrity, kindness, and modesty in my relationships(Phil 2:3-7)

As a student, I understand that my teachers may assign homework in order to better my understanding of a subject. I understand that it is my responsibility to come prepared to class and have my homework completed. If I fail to complete my homework and do not come prepared to class for the second time, I will have a parent/student/teacher conference. A continuation of this lack of responsibility may result in further disciplinary measures.

I understand that the following is not acceptable:

- Cell phones and electronic devices in class (These may be brought on campus, but kept only in backpack.)
- No use of air pods/ear-buds during class.
- Use of profanity or any inappropriate language
- Harassment of any student or bullying of any kind.
- No weapons or igniters of any kind are allowed on campus.

If a student's behavior is disruptive or inappropriate, the teacher will take the following approach:

First The teacher will speak to the student in the class, identifying the behavior and its negative effects, and will help the student to choose a more appropriate behavior.

Second (offense of same behavior or attitude) The teacher will take the child aside privately and talk about the offense (to find underlying cause, etc.). Teacher and student may choose to pray before returning to class. Teacher will make note of incident and notify the Director. A note or conference with parent and teacher may follow to make the parent aware of situation.

Third (offense of same behavior or attitude) The student will be taken to the receptionist. Director and parent will be notified. A meeting of the Director, parent, teacher, (if necessary) and student will be conducted. Discipline report will be filed. Three Discipline Reports may result in dismissal with no tuition refund.

Severe Disruption: Child will be sent immediately out to the receptionist and the director and parents will be notified. A meeting will be held with the parties involved to determine course of action. Verbal threats or physical aggression of any kind (hitting, kicking, biting) will not be tolerated and are grounds for immediate dismissal with no tuition refund.

Due to the nature of this program, it is imperative that students come with a willingness to learn, to cooperate with one another, and to respect authority. HHG Tutorial reserves the right to dismiss a child who displays a consistent pattern of disrespect, cheating or behavior that is not acceptable for the program. To that end, HHG will also never tolerate bullying of any student for any reason. Bullying another student is grounds for expulsion. We have a zero tolerance policy. Treat others like you want to be treated.

Writers give credit through accepted documentation styles, such as parenthetical citation, footnotes, or endnotes; a simple listing of books and articles is not sufficient. Plagiarism is the equivalent of intellectual robbery and cannot be tolerated in an academic setting. Student writers are often confused as to what should be cited. Some think that only direct quotations need to be credited. While direct quotations do need citations, so do paraphrases and summaries of opinions or factual information formerly unknown to the writers or which the writers did not discover themselves. Exceptions for this include factual information which can be obtained from a variety of sources, the writers' own insights or findings from their own field research, and what has been termed common knowledge.
